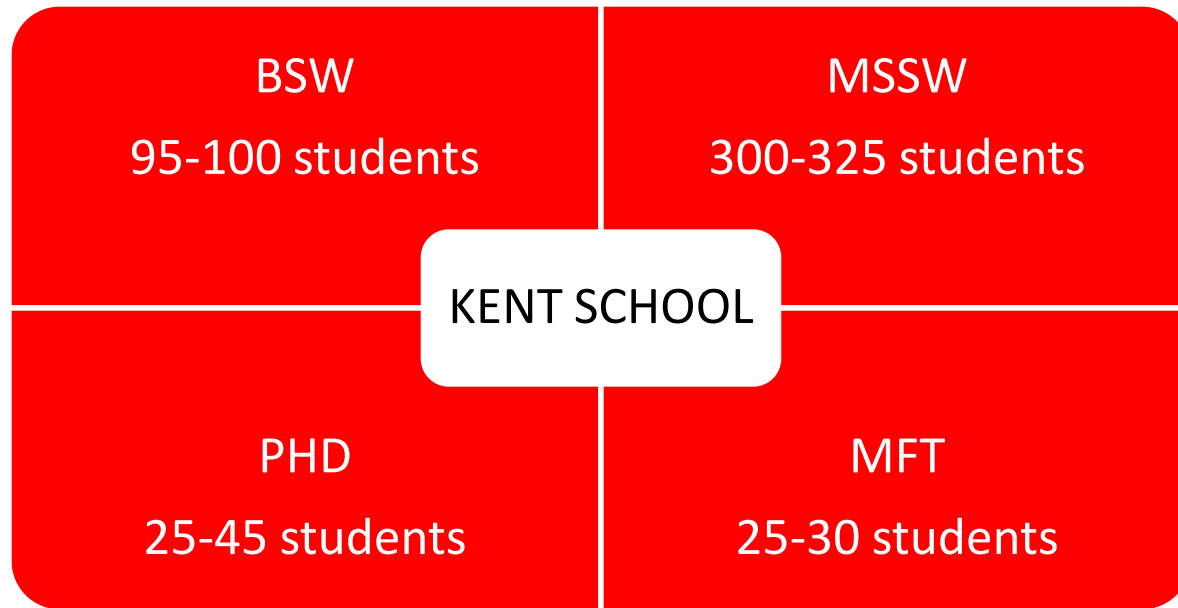
Research

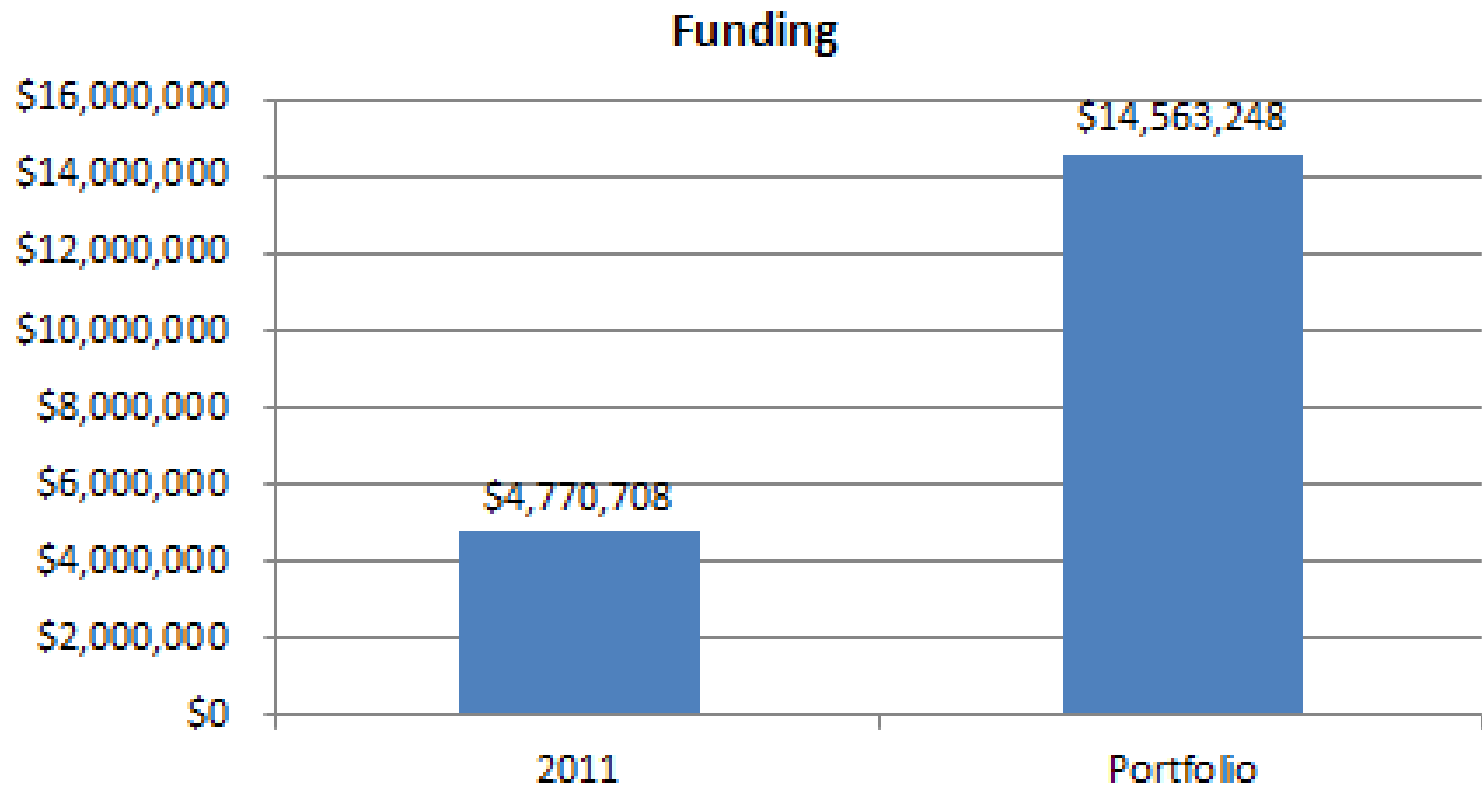

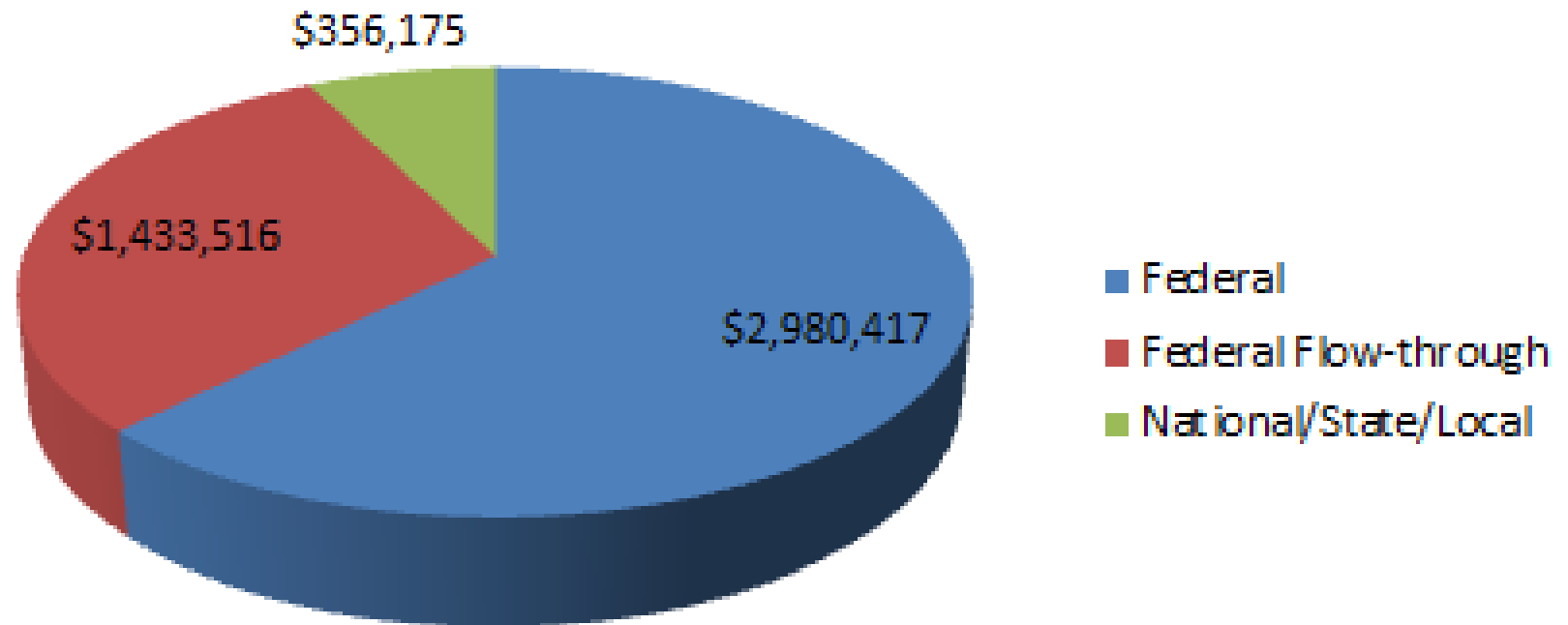

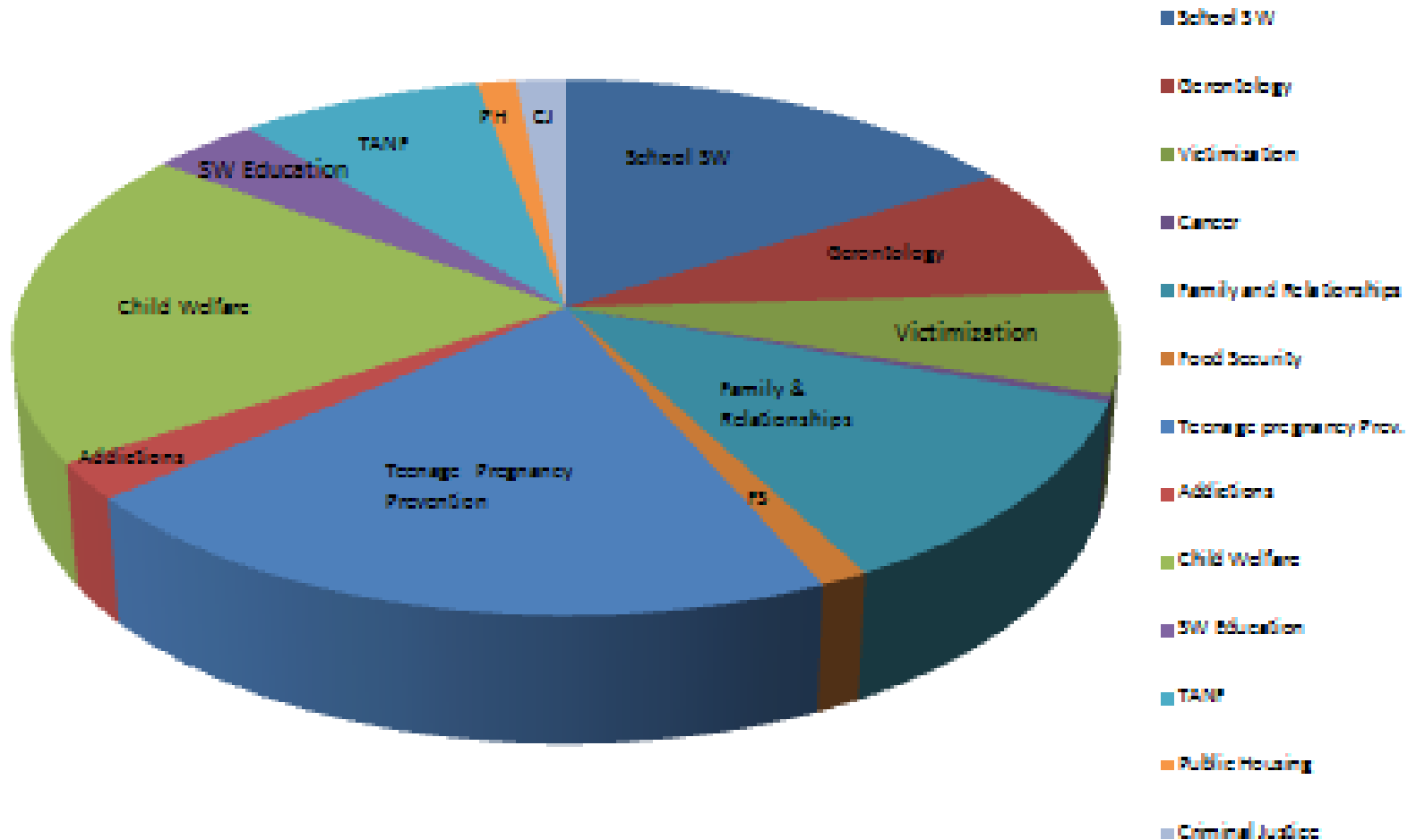

Capital Campaign

Funding for an additional position in oncology social work to support programmatic and administrative needs:

- Amount needed: **\$1 million**

Funding for a scholarship endowment for students to prepare for a career in oncology social work. This supports the school's continuing interest in building national preeminence in oncology social work education and practice.

- Amount needed: **\$1 million**

Capital Campaign – cont.

Funding for a scholarship endowment for students in the school's gerontology social work emphasis within the Master of Science in Social work program

- Amount needed: **\$3 million**

Funding for the construction of a new building to house Kent School. Currently our operations are housed on both the Belknap and Shelby campuses in seven buildings, not including classrooms.

- Amount needed : **\$15 million**
